# Teresa Dilliard

Teresa Dillard, Teen Coordinator at the Denton Public Library, is originally from Greensboro but moved near the Denton area 32 years ago. She has a background in education and earned a dual Bachelor of Arts degree in Elementary Education (K-6) and Special Education (K-12) from Pfeiffer University. She worked as a teacher in schools in Davidson County, including Denton Elementary School, as well as Stanly and Randolph Counties. Now working in libraries, she describes her position as an "easy fit" due to her history of teaching high school English. She loves her job because so much of what she does is fun and low-stress. In her position, she gets to do three of her favorite things: play, socialize, and be creative. During her weekly teen program as well as her outreaches to South Davidson High School, she can implement engaging activities like board games and crafts. Her outreach services are critical for the community, as she and the library provide materials for students who do not have accessible transportation for library visits. She is an extremely creative person who likes to "think outside the box." Being at the library allows her to exercise these gifts daily. Because the Denton Library serves many homeschool families and students, Teresa's weekly teen group has around 19 attendees.





She has a lot of ideas for future programs for teens including dinner and a movie with popcorn and pizza and a Renaissance-themed lock-in. In addition, she has already successfully utilized the library's kitchen cart by making glass candy and hopes to continue doing cooking programs. One of the reasons that Teresa's programs are so successful is due to having an open line of communication with her participants, blending her ideas and expertise with their interests. She describes herself as an "open book" and enjoys both painting and drawing, hence her creative skills. Family is extremely important to her, and she loves going on family vacations to places like the beach. She likes reading historical fiction along with works by Christian-based authors. We are glad that Teresa is a member of the Denton Public Library staff and encourage those with teens to seek her out for programs.









#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

# Theresa Matthews

Theresa Matthews, a patron of the Denton Public Library, moved to town at age 5 and has lived there for a great portion of her life. As a young girl, she spent much of her time at the Denton Library, describing it as "important to me growing up." She enjoyed books that centered around strong female characters like Jo March from Little Women and Tess of the D'Urbervilles by Thomas Hardy. She also read many classic books by authors like Charles Dickens and 20th-century series such as the Trixie Belden mysteries. As an adolescent, she began a close relationship with writing and words, working for her father, editor of the Denton Record. After graduating from Denton High School, she attended Catawba College in Salisbury, earning a Bachelor's Degree in Literature and Drama. While at Catawba, she continued writing by reporting for the college paper.

She has been employed in a variety of roles including a hotel in Chapel Hill, the High Point Theater, and in customer service for a furniture manufacturer. After living in Chapel Hill and then Thomasville, she and her husband decided to relocate to a more spacious home as their family grew, settling in her hometown of Denton. For some time now, she has worked with her husband, wearing many hats as a bookkeeper and again in customer service within their company, MKM Sales Incorporated, or Minuteman Upholstery Supply. Their family-owned business sells supplies used by consumers such as DIYers as well as to upholstery shops. Her career allowed her to spend a lot of time with her family, including her two daughters who also live in Davidson County.







Now in a different stage of her life, her relationship with the library has changed, but it is no less important.

She now takes her three grandchildren there one day a week, attending story time when they are able. She loves the summer reading program and has made financial contributions to the library so children have access to programs and materials for their learning. Recently, this past December, she took her grandchildren to Denton Public Library's Second Annual Candy Cane Dance and had a wonderful time.

She is very involved in the community as an active member of the Denton Lions Club. She enjoys reading historical fiction books, like Diana Gabaldon's Outlander series and books by Lisa See. She loves the staff of the Denton library, describing branch manager Susan Craven as "innovative" and staff members that are "so connected with the kids." Considering the dedication and talent of library staff, along with all the services and collections the library offers, Matthews takes pride in the fact that the Denton Library has become a central part of the community.
